

A Remembrance of Robert Waymon Lindsey

January 13,1949—July 23, 2006



At Coronado High School, Bob played football and was a member of the Lettermen's Club.

In June of 1969 Bob married Sharon Dale Walker of Coronado. After a year in college studying languages, psychology, and sociology Bob joined the U.S. Air Force while continuing his education part-time. Bob spent his career in the Air Force as an Egyptian/Arabic linguist spending tours in Greece, Crete, and other locations.

Bob and Sharon later returned to Goodfellow Air Force Base in San Angelo, Texas where they established their home and where he pursued his Air Force career as well as his continuing studies in psychology and sociology.

After a distinguished 26-year career in the Air Force, Bob retired in 1995 as a Senior Master Sergeant. He then put the masters degree in psychology and sociology that he had earned to good use, taking a position at the VA Medical Center in Big Spring, Texas as a director and counselor in the center's drug and alcohol program.

Bob was a person of deep faith and for many years was a member of

Our Lady Of Peace Catholic Community at Goodfellow Air Force Base, Texas. He was also a lay Eucharistic minister and, for many years, taught catechism. In his spare time, Bob loved Bible study, fishing, racquetball, and tennis but his family was his joy.

Following a long battle against brain cancer, Bob was called home to his Heavenly Father on Sunday, July 23, 2006. He was preceded in death by his parents, Leroy and Elva Lindsey and a sister Kathryn Clancy, all of Portland, Oregon. Bob is survived by his wife Sharon of San Angelo, Texas; son Robert Lindsey Jr. and family of Big Spring, Texas; son Scott Lindsey and family of San Antonio, Texas; daughters Yvonne Lindsey and Marie Lindsey and their families of Austin, Texas; and a brother David Lindsey and a sister Patricia Najar, both of Portland, Oregon.
