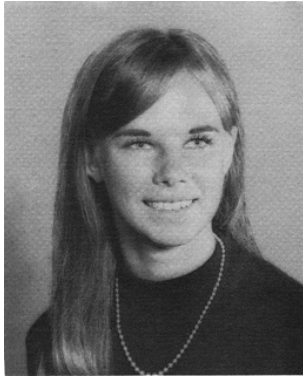




## A Remembrance of Marcia Sue McCoy

*December 4, 1949—December 16, 2017*



Marcia Sue McCoy passed away at age 68 on December 16, 2017 in San Antonio, Texas as a result of complications from a heart procedure she underwent in 2007. Marcia was born on December 4, 1949 in Key West, Florida to Claude and Dorothy McCoy.

Marcia attended Coronado High School in Coronado, California graduating in 1967 where she was a member of the Honor Society, Thespians, and a number of other school organizations.

After graduating from Coronado High School, Marcia studied drama at the University of Oklahoma, then earned a BA in Theater Arts from San Diego State University. After earning her degree, Marcia became the theater manager for the San Diego Civic Light Opera Association. Then, in the late 1970s, Marcia went to work for the now defunct San Diego Sockers of the North American Soccer League managing their ticket sales operations.



It was while working for the team that she met her husband William "Bill" Hanson who was public relations director for the organization. "We had season tickets to Chargers football games and I proposed to her on the scoreboard," Bill said. "She wasn't expecting it." Marcia and Bill were married in 1981. Marcia gave birth to a daughter Katherine in 1984—the family to San Antonio about a year later.

In her stay-at-home role, Marcia was a creative, fun mom who loved decorating for the holidays, especially Halloween. The decor was "...always above and beyond, with her theater background," her daughter Katherine Hanson said. "She wanted things to be memorable."

Once their daughter was older, Marcia decided to attend the University of Texas Health Sciences Center School of Nursing, earning a BSN four years later. After graduation, Marcia worked medical surgery at Baptist Hospital in San Antonio but went on to work in home health care—a field she truly loved.

Marcia was preceded in death by her parents Claude and Dorothy. She is survived by her husband Bill, daughter Katherine, and three sisters. A graveside service will be held in Vermont.
